



Walk: Riga Passenger Port to Alberta street is 1.2 km and takes about 15 min.

Art Nouveau is the most noticeable of all architecture styles in Riga. Approximately 800 of the city's buildings feature Art Nouveau facades, which include characteristic motifs such as stylised plants, floral and marine life, screaming and laughing masks, and sculptures depicting the female form, an eternal symbol of beauty.

The central location for Art Nouveau style buildings is the downtown quarter known as the "quiet centre". It is a vibrant feature in Riga's history, with Alberta Street truly the main gem. Each edifice is a unique masterpiece of design and construction.

Museum of art. In just 5 minute walk from Alberta street you will find the magnificent building of the most prominent art museum in Latvia.



Walk: Riga Passenger Port - Dome Square (central part of the Old Town) is 1.5 km and takes about 20 min.

The Old Town is the oldest section of Riga as well as the center of the city. It is the city's most popular area with tourists. In 1997, Riga's historic center was included in the UNESCO World Heritage List. The Old Town has highly diverse architecture. The city's architecture represents various periods – Romanticism, Gothic, Baroque, Classicism, and Modernism. The most impressive buildings in the Old Town are the Riga Cathedral and St. Peter's Church, offering a wonderful panoramic view on the city of Riga from a 72-meter high observation tower.

Central Market

Riga Central Market is only in short 10-minute walk from the Old Town. This is one of the largest and oldest markets in Europe with five food pavilions located inside vast converted zeppelin hangars. Recently a modern food court opened

in the Central market with more than 20 different food varieties – from oysters and champagne to burgers and pizza.



RAIL BALTICA

Rail Baltica is a new rail transport infrastructure with a goal to integrate the Baltic States in the European rail network. The project includes five countries – Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania and Poland and indirectly also Finland.

Rīga Central Station

This infrastructure object includes 2,6 km long railway line and Riga Central station terminal adaption for the Rail Baltica and passengers needs, as well as bridge over Daugava.

The improved station will integrate Rail Baltica into multi modal Rīga central transport hub, ensuring better mobility, connectivity, accessibility and improving safety.





Port of Riga

The port of Riga is a significant part of global and regional cargo supply chains and passenger traffic network in the Baltic Sea region, providing safe and reliable services. An integral part of the city, the Port recognises its social and environmental responsibilities and makes a strong contribution to the growth of Latvia's economy. The Port is driven by high performance standards and continuously strives to improve both the quality and breadth of services to clients.

The location at the crossroads of convenient sea and land routes between the markets of the European Union and Russia as well as other countries of Eurasian continent makes the Port of Riga an important component of the East-West cargo transportation corridor. Port of Riga can serve as important regional distribution hub on the South-North cargo transportation corridor.



Serviced 3 498 ships with a tonnage of 45.7 mln.GT

Multifunctionality combined with modern port infrastructure and security allows the Port of Riga to respond flexibly to changes at the cargo transportation market and to adapt to new requirements imposed by markets and customers.


The Freeport of Riga is located in the southern part of the Gulf of Riga of the Baltic Sea at the estuary of the River Daugava and is one of the main logistics hubs in the Eastern Baltic Sea region.

The port is strategically integrated into the European TEN-T networks of motorways and railways, as well as the European Motorways of the Sea that enables fast and efficient transportation of cargo from the EU to the CIS and Asian countries and backwards.



Port Dues and Rebates



Port Dues

(payable to the Freeport of Riga Authority)

RATE	APPLICATION
Canal due: 0.10 EUR/GT	Separately per arrival and departure
Sanitary due: 0.02 EUR/GT	Per call
Berthing due: 0.085 EUR/GT	Per each use of berth
Passenger due: 1 EUR	Separately per arrival and departure



Navigation fee

(payable to the Latvian Maritime Administration)

0.053 EUR/GT for the first ten visits per calendar year



Rebates

Cruise ships receive rebates on all Port Dues depending on the number of calls to the port within a calendar year, starting with the first cruise ship's call:

20% - upon 5th to 10th call at the Port per calendar year (1st category rebate);

40% - more than 10 calls at the Port per calendar year (2nd category rebate).






Freeport of Riga in 2019
